

FEATURED PORTS

SITKA, ALASKA

The copper-domed St. Michael's Cathedral bespeaks Sitka's Russian heritage. This is the place where the purchase of Alaska from Russia was completed. The New Archangel Dancers keep colorful traditions alive.

WRANGELL, ALASKA

Fur trappers founded this oldest settlement in Alaska, but soon trapped it out. Wrangell's Stikine River was the first route for prospectors headed for the Klondike. Today visitors come to photograph the bears gathered at Anan Creek.

ALERT BAY, ALASKA

This tiny Namgis First Nations community on British Columbia's Cormorant Island welcomes you with insights into aboriginal cultures and the world's tallest totem pole. Traditional potlatch artifacts are displayed at the U'mista Cultural Centre. For the most immersive experience join our Expedition Team to explore by kayak or Zodiac® on an optional Ventures by Seabourn® excursion.

HAINES, ALASKA

See Fort William Seward, a National Historic Landmark, and the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve, or take a ferry to Skagway, one of Alaska's most popular cruise ports, to ride the original narrow-gauge White Pass & Yukon Route Scenic Railway.





JUNEAU, ALASKA

Alaska's capital is a little citified, but still can't be reached by road. Visit its museum to see Inuit crafts. Drive to Mendenhall Glacier – the only one inside city limits. Or fly up in a helicopter, then visit the Red Dog Saloon.

KETCHIKAN, ALASKA

Ketchikan is the salmon capital of the world. The largest collection of traditional Native American totem poles in the world is at Totem Bight State Park, Potlatch Park, Saxman Native Village and the Totem Heritage Center.

PRINCE RUPERT, ALASKA

Visit the Khutzeymateen Grizzly Bear Sanctuary, one of the densest populations of these magnificent creatures anywhere. The Butze Rapids Park and Trail or the Metlakatla Wilderness Trail offer access to the area's lush coastal rain forest.

ICY STRAIT POINT, ALASKA

Icy Strait Point is a unique community on Chichag of Island created and owned by a corporation of over 1,300 Native Americans of various local Tlingit tribes, offering visitors an enjoyable, educational experience of Alaska's native cultures.


HUBBARD GLACIER, ALASKA

Cruise Disenchantment Bay, exploring the awe-inspiring, six-mile (10 km) face of the largest tidewater glacier in North America, which reaches 400 feet (130 m) in height. Join your Expedition Team as we explore this glacier front in optional Zodiac® and kayak tours. There is simply no better way to explore Hubbard Glacier.

TRACY ARM/ENDICOTT ARM, ALASKA

The Tracy Arm-Fords Terror Wilderness consists of two 30-mile fjords extending from glaciers out to Holkham Bay. Enjoy scenic cruising among the icebergs in these fjords. Your Expedition Team will also offer optional kayak or Zodiac® excursions in the arms, giving you an epic front row seat to the glacier front.





MISTY FJORDS, ALASKA

Cutting from the sea deep into virgin forest, these channels are a place of quiet grandeur and a rare opportunity to view America’s true wilderness. The Expedition Team will offer optional excursions including kayaking and a Zodiac® tours to “God's Pocket”, an exceptional secluded area in Misty Fjord with towering peaks, waterfalls and flowing rivers.

INIAN ISLANDS, ALASKA

These small islands at the end of Icy Strait have picturesque, rugged rocky shorelines and wind-sculpted forests, Marine life includes whales, bald eagles and sea lions, otters, and sea birds. Zodiacs® and sea kayaks provide up-close access on optional adventurous excursions.

ALASKA WILDLIFE

IN THE SEA, THE SKY AND THE FOREST – EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED

Alaska's prolific wildlife provides frequent but always unpredictable delights to your voyage. Expedition Team members add expert insights on their lives and habits, alert you to sightings, and answer questions.



BROWN BEARS

Brown bears and grizzly bears are the same species with many separate subspecies, including the Kodiaks. They vary in color but can be identified by the large shoulder hump on their back.



BLACK BEARS

Although the smallest of the bears found in North America, black bears are also the most numerous. Very adaptable and found in many different habitats, they can climb trees with great efficiency.



MOOSE

Alaska's largest deer species are solitary by nature. Females are often seen feeding with young in shallow water. The huge males with their impressive palmate antlers are usually alone.



MOUNTAIN GOATS

The last living remnant of an ancient genus, mountain goats are rarely seen up close. They nimbly roam the snow-swept slopes, and their scarcity only increases the thrill of sighting them.



BALD EAGLES

The national symbol of the United States since 1782, bald eagles can soar high overhead and trust on their great eyesight to see fish a mile below.



HARBOR SEALS

One of the most common marine mammals in the northern hemisphere, harbor seals are small, weighing about 200 pounds and found in a variety of colors.



SEA OTTERS

Found most often in beds of kelp, the always adorable sea otters often dine on sea urchins, clams and shellfish. When resting or sleeping, they wrap themselves in kelp to keep from drifting away.



HUMPBACK WHALES

The relatively slow swimming and curious humpback whales were given their name because of the lumpy dorsal fin found on their backs. Humpbacks swim between Alaska and Hawaii each year, one of the longest migration routes of any animal.



ORCA WHALES

Also known as killer whales, orcas are one of the most widely distributed marine mammals in the world. Orca pods are matriarchal societies and consist of a female and her generational offspring.



STELLER SEA LIONS

Steller sea lions are the largest member of the eared seals, where males may be up to 11 feet long and weigh up to 2,500 pounds.

VANCOUVER, CANADA

Vancouver is a refreshingly different metropolis. Modern art, haute cuisine, and a wide variety of global cultures exist side-by-side with nature, including Stanley Park, one of the largest urban parks in North America, the Bloedel Conservatory, and the Vancouver Lookout.

SEATTLE, WASHINGTON

Often called the Emerald City because of its verdant surroundings and ever-present spirit of new opportunity, Seattle is a world of fascinating pursuits like art galleries, whale watching spots, local wineries and breweries, the Seattle Center and Space Needle, and numerous Native American historical sites.

VICTORIA, BRITISH COLUMBIA

This island off the coast of Vancouver has long been a yachting retreat and weekend escape of locals, and it's no wonder. Stunning period architecture, floating houseboats, the incomparable Butchart Gardens, Hatley Castle, the Inner Harbour, and Canada's oldest Chinatown all offer camera-ready enjoyment at every turn.



SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA

Stroll the famed Fisherman's Wharf past live music in Ghirardelli Square to the Presidio and views of the Golden Gate Bridge and Alcatraz Island. FEATURED PORTS

MONTRÉAL, QUÉBEC

Montréal is the largest French-speaking city outside Paris. The city, however, enjoys a unique French-Canadian *joie de vivre* all its own. Ascend Mont Royale for a view, or venture into the Laurentian Mountains for stunning autumn scenery.

QUÉBEC CITY, QUÉBEC

Dock near the Petit-Champlain quarter, Québec's oldest section. Above you, overlooking the St. Lawrence River, waits Old Québec, Dufferin Terrace and the Place des Armes – a combined UNESCO World Heritage Site.

SAGUENAY, QUÉBEC

It's a joyous occasion when a ship comes into Saguenay, at the head of a spectacular fjord. You'll be treated as an honored guest, and the natural splendors of the Laurentian forests are a favorite playground of the Québécois.

HAVRE-SAINT-PIERRE, QUÉBEC

Townfolk here speak nearly pure Acadian French, and their picturesque church boasts fascinating Innu artworks. The offshore Mingan Islands Reserve reveals marine fossils, bizarre monoliths and colonies of puffins and razorbills.

HALIFAX, NOVA SCOTIA

In The City of Trees, visit the Halifax Citadel and the iconic Town Clock, then head out to the restored and re-enacted 18th-century French Fortress of Louisbourg. Or take the scenic Lighthouse Route to picturesque Peggy's Cove.

BAR HARBOR, MAINE

The Titans of the Industrial Age chose Mt. Desert Island as their rustic retreat at the turn of the 20th century. Ascend Cadillac Mountain, the tallest peak on the North Atlantic seaboard, for panoramic views over Acadia National Park.

BOSTON, MASSACHUSETTS


Compact, red brick Boston is easy to enjoy. Follow the Freedom Trail past Old North Church, Paul Revere Park, Faneuil Hall, the Commons, Old Ironsides and more landmarks of America's birth. Just across the Charles River is Cambridge, and Harvard.

NEW YORK, NEW YORK

One of the thrills of a lifetime is sailing in or out of New York Harbor alongside the skyline of Manhattan and the Statue of Liberty lifting her torch. This is the Big Apple, one of the world's great cities.

SYDNEY, NOVA SCOTIA

Sydney is a photogenic and friendly place from which to explore Cape Breton Island's attractions, including historic re-enactors at Louisbourg Fortress, the breathtaking Cabot Trail and the Alexander Graham Bell Museum at nearby Baddeck.



ST. PIERRE, ST. PIERRE & MIQUELON

St. Pierre & Miquelon is 16 miles from Newfoundland and 2,400 miles from Europe. But the descendants of Basque, Breton and Norman fishermen here speak metropolitan French, and their customs, food and personalities are firmly Gallic.

CHARLOTTETOWN, PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

PEI's capital is full of buildings recalling a nostalgic 'Anne of Green Gables' Victorian past that still informs its present. The City Hall is a National Historic Site of Canada, proclaiming it the Birthplace of Confederation.

TROIS-RIVIÈRES, QUÉBEC

This very early French outpost in Canada preserves many of its historic buildings, including the Ursuline Convent dating from 1697. Tour the Old Prison with a former 'convict', or visit the Sanctuary of Notre Dame du Cap.


