RESPONSIBLE BY DESIGN

Le Commandant Charcot, born out of a seafaring spirit and the desire to be part of the pioneers that have driven PONANT since its creation, harnesses a multitude of technologies aimed at limiting our impact on the environments we visit. As the first hybrid electric-liquefied natural gas polar exploration ship, she combines energy recycling and controlled consumption, electrical quay connections, waste reduction and elimination of single-use plastics.

The outdoor Blue Lagoon, heated thanks to energy recovery, along with the heated indoor swimming pool, the snow cabin, the detox bar, the Cigar Lounge and the all-round outdoor promenade deck: these unique spaces provide total connection with the outdoor settings. In terms of gastronomy, the iconic signature dishes of Alain Ducasse are the finishing touch to a menu specially designed by the multi-starred Michelin chef.

POLAR EXPERTISE

All the teams of captains, officers, expedition leaders and naturalist guides have in-depth knowledge of the poles, their associated hazards and the attention needed to ensure safety. That means complete peace of mind for our guests, with an expedition team made up of 19 to 23 experts offering unique support on our polar cruises. In addition to this we have scientists on-board. We offer them a place to conduct their research in these key environments as part of the PONANT Science project.

Science on board

True to our commitment to a more responsible tourism, we support scientific research through the PONANT Science project. Le Commandant Charcot thus has two laboratories (wet and dry) available to researchers whose work focuses on the oceans, the environment and climate change. Hugues Decamus, chief mechanic, supported by Daniel Cron, scientific coordinator, are in charge of the smooth running of these operations.

What are your roles on board?

Hugues Decamus: The chief engineer is the ship's maintenance manager, so the engines obviously, as well as the plumbing, air conditioning, production of electricity and water, waste treatment, etc. But also, aboard Le Commandant Charcot, the science. Daniel Cron: I take care of all the scientific equipment acquired by PONANT and which is in operation on Le Commandant Charcot, mainly those of continuous measurements. For example, we constantly pump water under the hull when we sail in order to measure its salinity, temperature, etc. I also look after the scientific teams, who generally embark with a specific problem to examine. I help them install all the necessary equipment so that it is immediately operational. What we achieve is very much quality based. We receive only four researchers per session. That means I can pay special attention to their needs, and arrange as many outings as possible for samples. The term 'ship of opportunity' is very appropriate: we don't have a science ship, but we perform real science.

What advantage does *Le Commandant Charcot* offer these scientists?

Hugues Decamus: Currently there is no French scientific vessel capable of going that far into the ice. Le Commandant Charcot. is the only one. We therefore have here an exploration ship that embraces the spirit of Jean-Baptiste Charcot, disseminating knowledge and sharing it with the scientific community through open data, and also with the guests. In addition, we can perform measurements that are impossible for other vessels. The big advantage of this ship is that we undertake regular voyages, so we can carry out the same measurements repeatedly. Daniel Cron: We are, in effect, the only ones to return to basically the same places. Scientists like this because they can gather statistics over long periods of time and thus discern trends. They are also interested in going to places where few people go, and where they have never been, in terms of geography and times of the year.

Who are the scientists on board and how are they chosen?

Daniel Cron: They work for laboratories, universities and international institutes, such as the Alfred Wegener Institute (German polar institute), the CNRS, the Ifremer... Americans and Canadians are also very interested.

Hugues Decamus: We wanted to remain neutral in the selection process. We therefore launched a call for projects via a platform that brings together both international scientists with very varied specialties and the means that can serve various scientific opportunities. Twelve candidates were selected. In the face of this success, we are fully booked for the upcoming seasons.

In the footsteps of the legendary odyssey of the *Endurance* led by the famous Sir Ernest Shackleton, you too can embark on a polar exploration from the Weddell Sea to the Antarctic Peninsula, passing through the archipelago of South Shetland and South Orkney, to the fabulous South Georgia.

Live the exceptional: sail to the distant waters of the Weddell Sea and its tabular icebergs, the South Orkney Islands with their impressive glaciers, and the king penguin colonies of South Georgia.



Welcome to a pristine and isolated region: the northeast coast of Greenland! The opportunities for navigation and exploration of these wild and unknown frozen shores will surprise and enchant you. Our passage to the Far North will take you to one of the most difficult to access areas at the end of spring.

Live the exceptional: at this very start of summer, an early and still hostile time of year in the Arctic, set sail for the wild, untamed coast of Northeast Greenland and the experience of navigating through the ice of the Transpolar Drift Stream at that magical moment when nature begins to come back to life.
