In the polar regions, we are members of the IAATO and AECO: regulatory organisations that bring together different stakeholders to promote more responsible tourism. We have also made commitments at an international level, and are proud to be part of the UN programme to ban single-use plastics. We have earned numerous labels as a result of our actions, and our entire fleet has been awarded Cleanship certification by Bureau Veritas.

A safe and modern fleet

We are one of only a few cruise companies to sail under the French flag, which represents the highest level of safety. We respect strict specifications regarding crew training, health and safety protocols, and regular checks on our vessels. Designed on a more intimate scale, with just 16 to 165 staterooms, our ships are equipped with the most advanced technology for safe and responsible sailing.

On board, the restaurants, bars and lounges welcome you into a warm ambiance, complete with live music. All our ships are equipped with outdoor swimming pools (except *Le Ponant*) and wellness areas with fitness rooms, as well as spas and hairdressing salons offering expert treatments in collaboration with renowned brands (Clarins, Diptyque, Biologique Recherche, Sothys). The theatre is the place to be for all your expedition cruise briefings, as well as for film and documentary screenings, lectures and performances.

Although the company previously offered a trip to the Great Lakes of North America, the new offering in expedition mode promises to delight.



“We often think we know everything about the Great Lakes of North America. However, with our new routes, you can expect to experience unique moments and return home with an amazing new perspective on this part of the world. We have designed these expedition cruises hand in hand with the Great Canadian Lakes Association, for those who love human encounters and the great outdoors, as they are sure to lift the soul.

“We go to places where no tourist ship has ventured, such as the North Shore Inside Passage of Lake Superior, which we cross. This immersive trip is full of real gems that we will show you in expedition mode to get closer to nature and the local people. The experiences we give to our guests in this part of the world, accompanied by naturalist guides, allow them to rediscover their ability to wonder. On board inflatable boats, we set out to meet four local communities

(Terrace Bay, Rossport, Red Rock and Silver Islet) on First Nations land.

“I remember moving human encounters, such as sharing a meal made up of traditional dishes (Lake Superior trout with maple syrup, blueberry or cranberry pies, etc.), and a touching exchange with the ageless keeper of the Battle Harbour lighthouse. The entrance to the red sandstone sea caves of the Apostle Islands, which can only be reached by kayak, amazed me. Finally, one of the highlights of this exploration is a trip in a handmade canoe to view thousands of years old petroglyphs carved on remarkable cliffs by First Nations people. And then, how can you not be fascinated by the immensity of the horizon that opens up to you? These majestic vistas, enhanced by the autumn-coloured boreal forests, give this tableau vivants a spectacular and hypnotic beauty.”

Through the eyes of Alain Bidart

Wild flight in the archipelagoes of Northern Europe

Alain Bidart is a doctor of fluid mechanics and an ornithologist. He took part in scientific expeditions to Antarctica and the Pacific before devoting himself to expeditionary travel. Since 2010, he has been a naturalist guide for PONANT.



“I was captivated by the beauty of the British Isles. I particularly like the Scottish islands because of the way the people and the still wild natural environment live together in harmony. The different archipelagoes of Northern Europe share certain common features: green landscapes, isolated villages, a rich Celtic culture, large houses and gardens in the British style.

“However, each region also has its own character. The Hebrides are the most populated islands, with a wide variety of birds and plants, historic sites and wild islands. The Shetlands and Orkneys are short-grassed islands populated by sheep, seabirds and coastal birds, and few people. Lastly, the landscape of the Faroe Islands is similar to that of the Shetlands, but the culture there is Scandinavian. Guests will have plenty of time to observe the breathtaking scenery and stunning wildlife at close

quarters on shore and on inflatable boat trips. These agile craft enable us to reach virtually inaccessible wilderness areas under excellent safety conditions.

“It’s the seabirds and their colonies in these regions that fascinate me most: northern gannets, black-legged kittiwakes, common guillemots, razorbills... On Lunga Island, you’ll get the chance to see Atlantic puffins. I have a soft spot for these delightful birds with their colourful beaks, which are easy to approach. On Saint Kilda, the seabird colonies, including northern gannets, are also fascinating to watch. I also love it when nature surprises us. One day in the Hebrides, although they are very rarely seen, two huge basking sharks slipped effortlessly and majestically between our inflatable boats. An unforgettable experience!”



Did you know?

The name of Madeira's vibrant capital, Funchal, comes from the word funcho which means 'fennel' in Portuguese. When the first Portuguese landed there in the 15th century, they found that wild fennel grew abundantly on the site of the present town.

“Dubrovnik, Split and Hvar are must-sees on the shores of the Adriatic Sea. Through my numerous trips to Croatia, I have learned how to explore these iconic places, but I also wanted to show this country in a more intimate way. We have designed routes that focus on little-known or well-preserved gems. I'm thinking of the Brijuni islands, including Veliki Brijun, which we visit, and their typical Mediterranean vegetation, the small port on the peninsula of Primošten, a charming and colourful fishing village where no cruise ship calls, or the village of Bol, nestled between the sea and mountains on the island of Brač. You can see everywhere that the architecture has been preserved and that real attention has been

paid to restoring the buildings so that they retain their authenticity. We have also designed a ‘slow cruise’ route for this destination [see our ‘Landscapes and heritage of the Adriatic’ cruise, page 62], with long stopovers, in order to give guests time to experience the destination, and to enjoy the slower pace. So you can stroll around observing local life, swim, taste a vintage from the Brač vineyards or a local lamb or fish speciality, wander or shop in small streets, or all of these at once, as our stopovers often last a full day, sometimes until midnight. Finally, I chose each stopover location carefully. I want us to drop anchor in the heart of villages or in small historic ports worthy of the most beautiful postcards.”

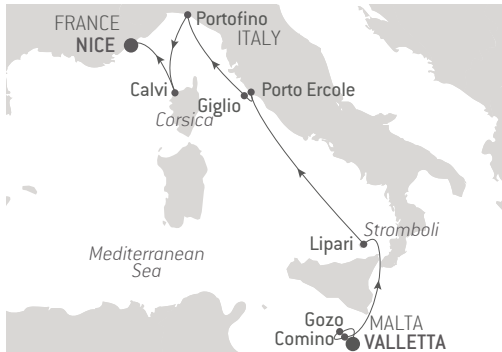

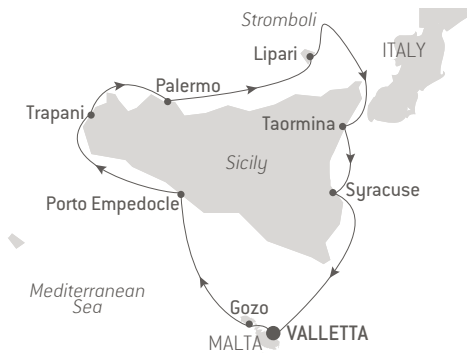

Geographically, historically and culturally at the crossroads of several regions, the shores of North Africa are a destination rich in discovery.

Lying next to an azure blue sea and nestled against the Aïdour hill, radiant **Oran** is a captivating city with Arab, Ottoman, French and Spanish influences. A different idea of Japan

Ryo Ijichi is a naturalist guide specialising in the polar regions, who joined PONANT in 2013. Today he is an expedition leader and commercial manager for Japan and Korea, and enjoys sharing his knowledge as much as he does exploring his native region.



“People often think of Japan as modern Tokyo and traditional Kyoto, so I designed the routes in this region to demonstrate that my country is full of remarkable, diverse places. You may not know it, but each region has its own culture, tradition and gastronomy. As an island state, Japan was originally more connected by sea than by land. Most of the cities, the gateways to these regions, therefore faced the ocean. Imagine what a great playground this is for an expedition ship discovery. We decided to link these ancient towns together, and access some beaches or small villages by inflatable boat, a first for a cruise ship in Japan. Guests will be able to visit the picturesque village of Sakitsu, which during the 300-year Edo period was able to hide its then forbidden practice of Christianity. They will also

be able to observe the sumptuous coral reefs and lush mangroves around the subtropical islands of Okinawa. A visit to the fishing village of Ine will take them back in time to the miraculously preserved traditional wooden stilt houses. And to fully reveal the charms of the different regions of the archipelago, what better way than to immerse yourself in the daily life of the Japanese people by interacting with them, discovering new dishes that will then be cooked on board or falling in love with the local crafts? Although words are sometimes not necessary, we make sure that language is not an obstacle, thanks to our multilingual guides. I hope that the guests will be able to make connections and, above all, take with them a completely different idea of this unexpectedly rich country from their trip.”



‘Sacred Island’ of Miyajima

Considered one of Japan’s most beautiful sites, the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Miyajima Island is home to the Itsukushima Shinto shrine, founded in 593, and its famous vermilion *torii* (gate) rising to 16 metres. To add to the spiritual aura of this special place, 500 deer roam freely in the park, with the lush forests of Mount Misen as a backdrop.

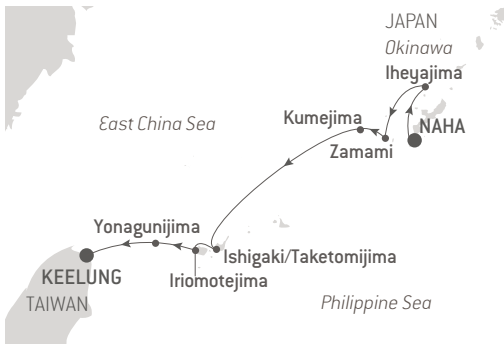

"A real dilution of space-time"

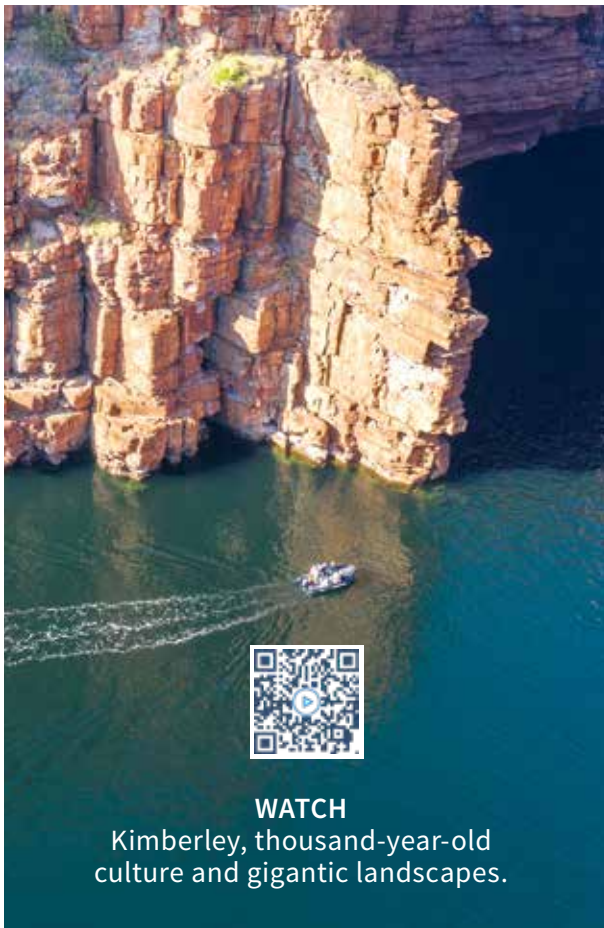
Having worked as a young lieutenant on board *Le Paul Gauguin* in the early 2000s, Captain Michel Quioc took over the vessel in February 2022. He's very happy to be back on board and part of this ship, which he says "has a very strong personality". Here, he gives us his impressions.



"Le Paul Gauguin, in natural wood and high-quality materials, has much space and volume while retaining an intimate quality. Its cruise programme includes long stopovers in unspoilt settings. It thus embodies my definition of luxury: having time and space. You can also count on an extremely loyal and welcoming crew. You go to Polynesia for the beautiful scenery, but you are very quickly won over by the warmth of the welcome there, starting with that of the Gauguines and Gauguins, the on-board Polynesian hosts. Their joie de vivre and kindness are very infectious and spontaneous. You also experience a real dilution of space-time. Consider that these archipelagos are in the heart of the Pacific Ocean, far from everyday life: a unique opportunity to take time to

relax... And, as I tell the guests at the end of the trip, they can take back with them this very special energy: Polynesian mana, and share it with their loved ones.

"Sailing in Polynesia is unique: at each stopover, the ship must navigate a pass, i.e. a navigable area, which is often quite narrow and shallow, where the coral reef separates the ocean from the lagoons it protects. Only the Marquesas Islands, which are young mountains rising steeply from the depths, are not affected by this phenomenon. In contrast, the Tuamotu islands, the oldest archipelago in Polynesia, are protected by their coral reef, but have collapsed below the surface."

Passport must contain at least two completely clear, blank, unused visa pages for each visa required, not including any amendment pages. IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Visas: before departure, please check carefully that your visas are valid for the right date and time spent in the countries in order to avoid unpleasant situations.

Warning about the use of drones: the use of drones aboard PONANT ships, whether they are sailing at sea, at a port of call or anchored, is strictly forbidden. The use of drones on land in the Arctic and Antarctic regions is also strictly forbidden by international polar regulations. In other regions, it may be possible to use drones on land if permission

has been obtained from the relevant authorities of each country and each region travelled through, as well as a pilot's licence that should be obtained from your home country. Passengers are responsible for obtaining these permits; they should be able to present them at all times. Passengers who do not obtain these authorisations expose themselves to the risk of legal proceeding.

Medication: if you have a medical condition, do not forget your prescription.

- Complimentary polar parka: for all cruises marked with the logo 'Parka Gift', a PONANT polar water-resistant parka is offered (adult sizes only; in case of consecutive cruises, only one parka per person).
- Complimentary boot hire: boot rental will be offered onboard (for adults only) on expedition cruises where the logo 'Free Boot Rental' appears.
- Ports of call, visited sites, outings and landings will depend on weather conditions, position of ice, winds and the state of the sea. These can force a change of plans at any time. The Captain and the Expedition Leader may at any time cancel or stop any activity, or even modify the itinerary. The final itinerary will be confirmed by the Captain, who will take into account the touristic quality of the sites and above all, the

FOR CRUISES OFFERING SCUBA DIVING



Passengers may take part in scuba diving activities, providing certain conditions are respected, in line with the applicable health, scientific and medical conditions in force on the day of the dive.

Passengers who wish to scuba dive are required to provide the onboard diving monitor with a valid medical certificate authorising them to scuba dive, as well as their certification card and their up-to-date dive log. Within the context of the health measures relating to COVID-19, you will also be required to complete a health declaration. You will be given this form when you pre-book your dive.

For yachting cruises, the minimum level required for scuba diving is 1 star CMAS or the PADI Open Water Diver (or equivalent). The certification card, the diving log book and a recent medical certificate

(less than 12 months) must be presented to our main diving instructor at the beginning of the cruise.

For expedition cruises, the minimum level required for scuba diving is 2 star CMAS or the PADI Advanced Open Water Diver (or equivalent). The certification card, the diving log book and a recent medical certificate (less than 12 months) must be presented to our main diving instructor at the beginning of the cruise.

Mask and snorkel: for health reasons due to COVID-19, we strongly recommend that you come on board with your own mask and snorkel. As an exception, you will be able to borrow them in accordance with sanitary conditions.
