The Gauguines and Gauguins accompany guests on board to help them learn about Polynesian culture. These local hosts, also our guests, are ambassadors for the islands where they grew up and the ocean that nurtured and protected them, and they are the soul of Le Paul Gauguin. Hinanui Ina and Mihimana tell us about themselves.

The sounds of your first names already take us on a journey... What do they mean?

Hinanui Ina: I'm originally from Tahiti. In Polynesian beliefs, Hina is the name of the Moon goddess. And *nui* means 'great'. So Hinanui, 'the great Hina'.

Mihimana: I'm also Tahitian and my name means 'the power of thought'.

Who are the Gauguines and the Gauguins?

Hinanui Ina: We are dancers, musicians and singers. As well as welcoming guests, our 'mission' is to take them to the heart of Polynesia, our culture and traditions – of which we have a great knowledge, much more than the mere 'postcard'. With us, both on board and on land, they learn the basics of Tahitian dance and a few rudiments of our language. They learn the secrets of weaving to make wreaths, baskets and hats. Guests are also very curious about our tattoos and their meanings.

Which facet of Polynesian culture do you think most fascinates the guests?

Hinanui Ina: What most fascinates those who come to see us is our way of life, I think. Our simplicity, our kindness.

Mihimana: We never forget that, for some guests, this may be the trip of a lifetime. So it's our duty to make this a moment they will never forget. 'Receiving' is part of our education. 'Being Tahitian' means being friendly, smiling and always ready to help others. Wherever they go, in whatever country, Tahitians greet others, even if they receive no response. Living on a small island where everyone knows everyone else fosters solidarity and a sense of community.


'Being Tahitian' also means living in harmony with the ocean...

Mihimana: Some families perpetuate this deep bond across the generations by tattooing on their bodies the marine animal that symbolises them, protects them and tells their story: a shark, a dolphin, a turtle... It is also said that when a Polynesian dies, their soul returns to the ocean. When someone dies, we take to the sea in pirogues or on surfboards. We sing and throw a wreath of flowers into the sea in tribute to the deceased. These are very strong traditions here.

What is the nicest thing anyone has said to you at the end of a trip?

Hinanui Ina: "We'll be back." And the guests return. At the end of each cruise, we usually sing a Polynesian song. It's not unusual to see a few tears fall. It's always a very emotional moment, both for the guests and for us.

Tatau, the body speaks

The traditional Polynesian tattoo, the *tatau*, has been practised for thousands of years, from the Marquesas Islands to Samoa, from New Zealand to the Society Archipelago, but it could have disappeared. This unique know-how was banished by European settlers at the end of the 18th century, but is now enjoying a true renaissance. Is it just a fad? No, it is the triumph of an enduring culture.

Identity card

"Ta-tau, ta-tau, ta-tau"... This mysterious rhythmic pattern was first heard by explorer James Cook during his expedition to the South Pacific seas. It is the melody of the Polynesian tattoo artist. The sound of his tools knocking together, a wooden handle with a small comb attached – made of bone, shark teeth or tortoise shell. The tattoo artist taps it with a mallet to prick the skin. First, the teeth of the comb are dipped in an ink made from candlenut charcoal, diluted in oil or water. In 1769, James Cook – and very soon, the whole of Europe – encountered these curious bluish patterns covering the arms, torsos, legs and backs of Polynesian locals.

But Marquesans, Samoans, Tongans, Hawaiians, Tahitians and Māori have been using their bodies as a canvas to 'engrave' their history, genealogy and the important events in their lives for close to 3,000 years. The *tatau* was a rite of passage, intended to mark an identity, the passage of time, a social rank, or a personality. These designs effectively replace writing in ancient Polynesian societies, which are rich in oral traditions.


Everyone has a story

Over the centuries, each archipelago has developed its own art of tattooing. From a mountainous island to an atoll dotted with palm trees, the styles and the symbols differ. Everyone tells their own story around their preferred totems. So there are as many designs as there are people with tattoos! While Marquesan *tikis*, representations of Polynesian demigods, symbolise protection and power, the fish is a mark of prosperity, the turtle of good health and family ties, and the shark's teeth of strength and security. The birds and waves represent travel and spirituality.

Where it is placed is also important. On the shoulder is a sign of strength and bravery, on the torso expresses generosity and sincerity, and on the head symbolises wisdom. Although customs are changing, women's tattoos are still traditionally confined to discreet, delicate adornments on the hands, feet or lips. A little ring of tiare flowers around an ankle is a testimony to grace, beauty and sensuality.

Renaissance of an art form, and respect for a culture

Deemed 'barbaric' by the European missionaries of the Age of Enlightenment, the traditional practice of tattooing was outlawed. But it proved its resilience and almost 150 years later, the art of *tatau* returned to its former glory. Although today's techniques have been largely modernised, some tattooists continue to perpetuate the skills of their ancestors and, through them, the history and culture of Polynesia. The revival of the *tatau* is much more than a trend, it is part of a formidable assertion of identity in the heart of the South Pacific and beyond.







During each of the ship's itineraries in French Polynesia, we offer you a day out of time, for an authentic escape, off the island of Taha'a.


This island interlude is an opportunity to experience authentic periods of relaxation in a heavenly setting.



This platform was once a highly important political, ceremonial and funerary centre. The island also has a wonderful range of nature and wildlife to reveal to curious guests who come to explore.











Wondrous moments are assured in the seabed of the Tuamotus, the oldest islands in Polynesia, from the lagoon of Rangiroa, classed as one of the most beautiful underwater sites on the planet by Captain Cousteau, to the warm waters of the UNESCO biosphere reserve of Fakarava. Slip into fins, mask and snorkel to swim in these natural aquariums where multicoloured fish, rays and harmless sharks dance among the reefs, and where you can feel at one with the ocean.



Warm and personal... A trip to the Cook Islands means an exploration of prodigious landscapes and the philosophy of a sweet life. The largest of them, Rarotonga, lies surrounded by a coral reef on which the waves of the South Pacific break. The profile of the jagged mountains stands out against the intense blue of the sky on this perfectly circular island. Snorkelling enthusiasts should take note that there is a world of underwater treasures to explore at Aitutaki, which is a haven of peace and simplicity.

Their wild beauty encompasses the charm of the Marquesas, sung about by Jacques Brel and inspiring Paul Gauguin's art. The landmarks change dramatically in the 'Land of Men', rising steeply from the depths of the ocean, with the reliefs abrupt and the vegetation abundant. Like their islands, the soul of the Marquesans is unique, infused with an ancestral spirit. The islanders, famous throughout Polynesia for the delicate intricacy of their craftsmanship, sculpt objects out of wood, stone and bone, and are renowned for their prowess in the art of tattooing.



Formalities

For all cruises

The information below is current but subject to change at any time without advance notice from government authorities. Please consult your respective government agencies for visa and health information.

Passport valid for at least six (6) months beyond the completion of your trip. Passport must contain at least two completely clear, blank, unused visa pages for each visa required, not including any amendment pages. Visa

pages with stains or ink from other pages in the passport are not usable. Guests who deviate from the scheduled embarkation or disembarkation port should research the foreign entry requirements for the port country. Due to government regulations, regrettably, PONANT will have to deny boarding to any guest who fails to obtain the appropriate travel documentation for their trip.

- (1) USA: if your flight passes through the United States, you must request an ESTA (travel autorisation) before your departure, online via https://esta.cbp.dhs.gov/esta. A copy of your ESTA must be sent to PONANT no later than 45 days before the date of departure. We also ask that you print it out and keep it in your passport throughout your trip.
- (2) Canada: if your flight passes through Canada, you must obtain an electronic travel authorisation (eTA) prior to your departure so you can pass through Vancouver. Apply online at: https://www.canada.ca/en/immigration-refugees-citizenship/services/visit-canada/eta/apply.html
- (3) Fiji: for the cruise from Papeete to Lautoka, entry formalities to Fiji will be carried out on board. For the cruises from Lautoka to Papeete and Lautoka to Bali, you will receive an 'Arrival in Fiji' letter in English with your travel documents to present on arrival at Nadi airport.

- (4) Indonesia: on this particular cruises, the entry and/or exit port in Indonesia do not allow for visa-exemption. Your visa will be delivered and charged onboard (45 USD subject to change) and valid for 30 days.
- (5) Papua New Guinea: visa delivered onboard free of charge.
- (6) East Timor: visa delivered and charged onboard (30 USD subject to change).
- (7) Australia: an Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) must be obtained before your arrival in Australia. For more information, please visit https://immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/visas/getting-a-visa/visa-finder/visit. Carriers should be aware that there will not be any physical evidence in your passport. A copy of your ETA must be sent to PONANT at the latest 45 days prior to your cruise date. We also ask you to keep a copy of your ETA and keep it with your passport throughout the duration of your trip. Australian customs regulations are very strict, especially for the import of food items such as fresh food (even sealed), fruits, eggs, meat, plants, vegetables, seeds, grains. It is recommended that you contact your health professional for any specific medical advice relating to travel through these regions, including advice on malaria prevention and dengue fever.

Important information

To guarantee your entry into one or several countries, you must ensure that you comply with the formalities and health requirements specific to each destination. In just a few clicks on our online search engine, find all the
