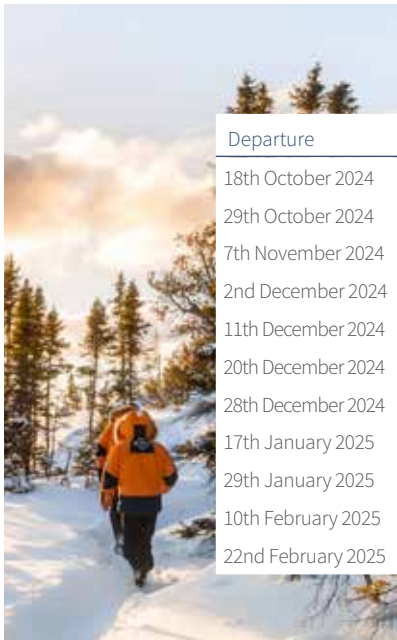

We have earned numerous labels as a result of our actions, and our entire fleet has been awarded *CleanShip* certification by Bureau Veritas.

We are one of only a few cruise companies to sail under the French flag, which represents the highest level of safety. We respect strict specifications regarding crew training, health and safety protocols, and regular checks on our vessels. Designed on a more intimate scale, with just 16 to 165 staterooms, our ships are equipped with the most advanced technology for safe and responsible sailing.

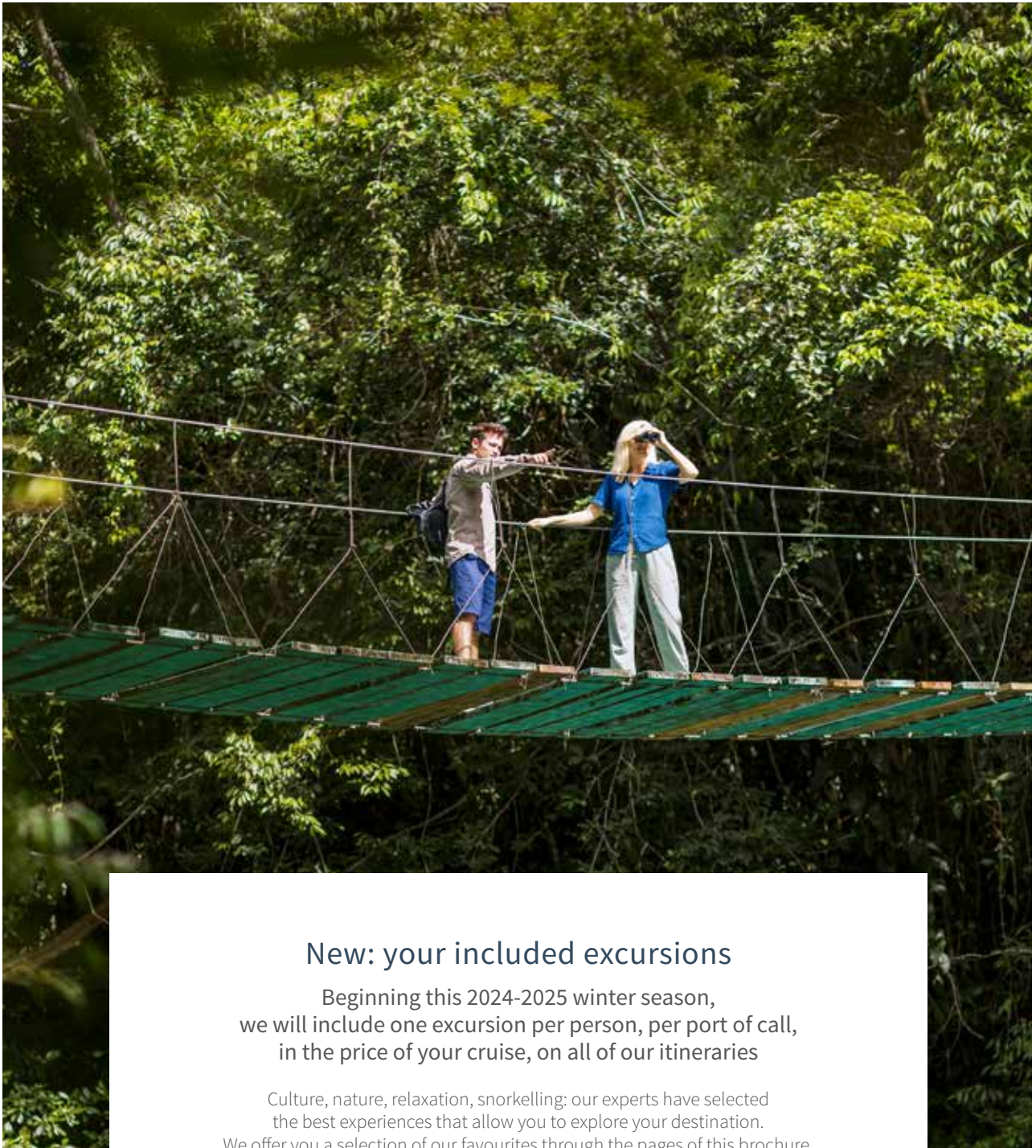

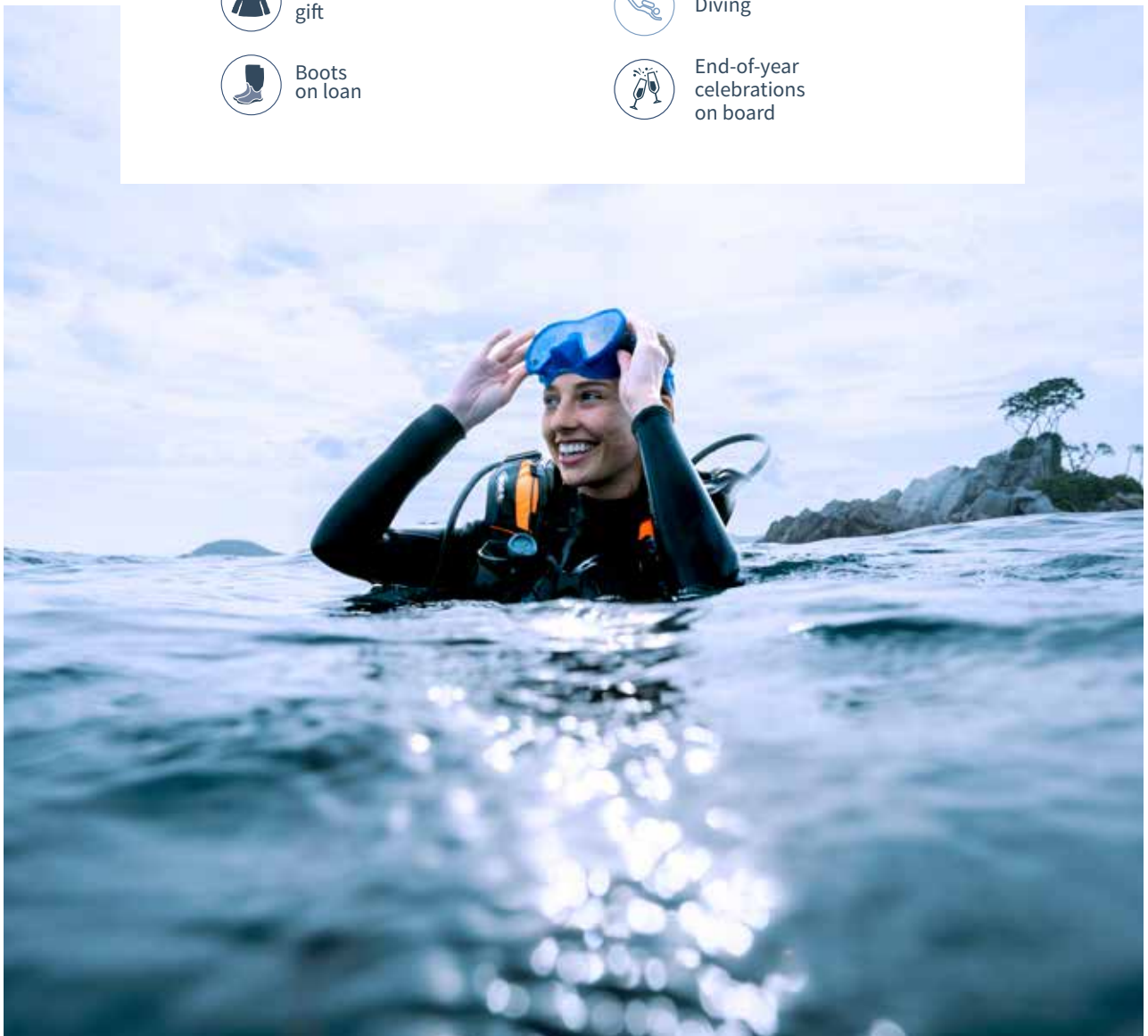

Through the eyes of Alain Bidart

A polar passion

Alain Bidart is a naturalist guide with a passion for ornithology. He has been travelling the polar regions aboard PONANT ships for many years. His love affair with nature began when he was a child, but it was an expedition to the Antarctic polar ice cap that confirmed his vocation.



"It was reading a Reader's Digest book on Antarctica at university, with a preface by Jean-Louis Étienne, that sparked my interest in the White Continent, which has now become a passion.

Antarctica and the Subantarctic islands are totally wild with no permanent inhabitants, and to my mind are the most extraordinary places in the world. Down there, mankind dominates nothing and the animals are not afraid of us. On a beach in South Georgia, I saw guests weeping with emotion near a colony of penguins. It's an experience that you just can't imagine, particularly if you're a European used to animals being at a distance when we're around. The raw beauty of the Antarctic landscapes never ceases to amaze me. On the peninsula, climbing the snow-covered mountain valleys with glaciers at the sea's edge is simply unforgettable. Elsewhere, in the Falkland Islands, it seems almost tropical at first glance. Landings are often made on white sandy beaches with dense tussocks of tall grasses in

the background. One of my favourite memories is of a search for a large colony of black-browed albatrosses in the islands. The tussock grass was so thick that it prevented us from getting through. At one point we broke through and came face to face with a plain filled with thousands of young birds on their nests, opening their beaks wide in surprise. It was totally unexpected! The guests took turns in small groups, hidden behind the grasses, to observe the spectacle. That's what I like about my job as a naturalist. Being with people in nature, educating them and inspiring them. If I can achieve that on my travels, then I've done what I set out to do."

"In Antarctica, you can't expect anything, you have to be open to new discoveries, to what you're going to observe, to what you're going to feel, physically."



Wonder in every season

In Antarctica, the end of the year is a key period for the pelagic fauna that comes ashore to reproduce. There are colonies of nesting penguins and seabirds to observe, along with sea lions and elephant seals looking after their young. The start of the new year brings with it the hatching of eggs and the touching sight of new-borns and their parents. Then, at the end of the austral summer, the youngsters become independent and take to the water to start life on their own.

The sea lion we thought was a lion

The Valdés Peninsula near Puerto Madryn sees thousands of South American sea lions set up camp each year for the breeding season. Distinguishable by their large, bulging heads and necks, males are sometimes known as 'sea wolves' or 'southern sea lions'.

They measure up to 2.3 metres long and weigh up to 350 kg, while females weigh no more than 200 kg.

The Kingdom of Penguins

This is the name by which South Georgia is known, one of the few land masses in the Southern Ocean where penguins and albatrosses come ashore to nest and breed. In Saint Andrews, up to 100,000 pairs of king penguins can be seen, as well as a few gentoo, chinstrap and rockhopper penguins.

Humpback whales, returning to equilibrium

Threatened with extinction in 150 years, the humpback whale population fell from 27,000 worldwide in 1830 to 450 in the 1950s, leading to a ban on hunting in 1982. 30 years after, scientists have seen the direct benefits of this ban, especially in the Southern Ocean. By restoring the population to nearly 93% of its original number, the balance of an entire marine ecosystem, where the whale, a great lover of krill, plays a central role, is preserved.

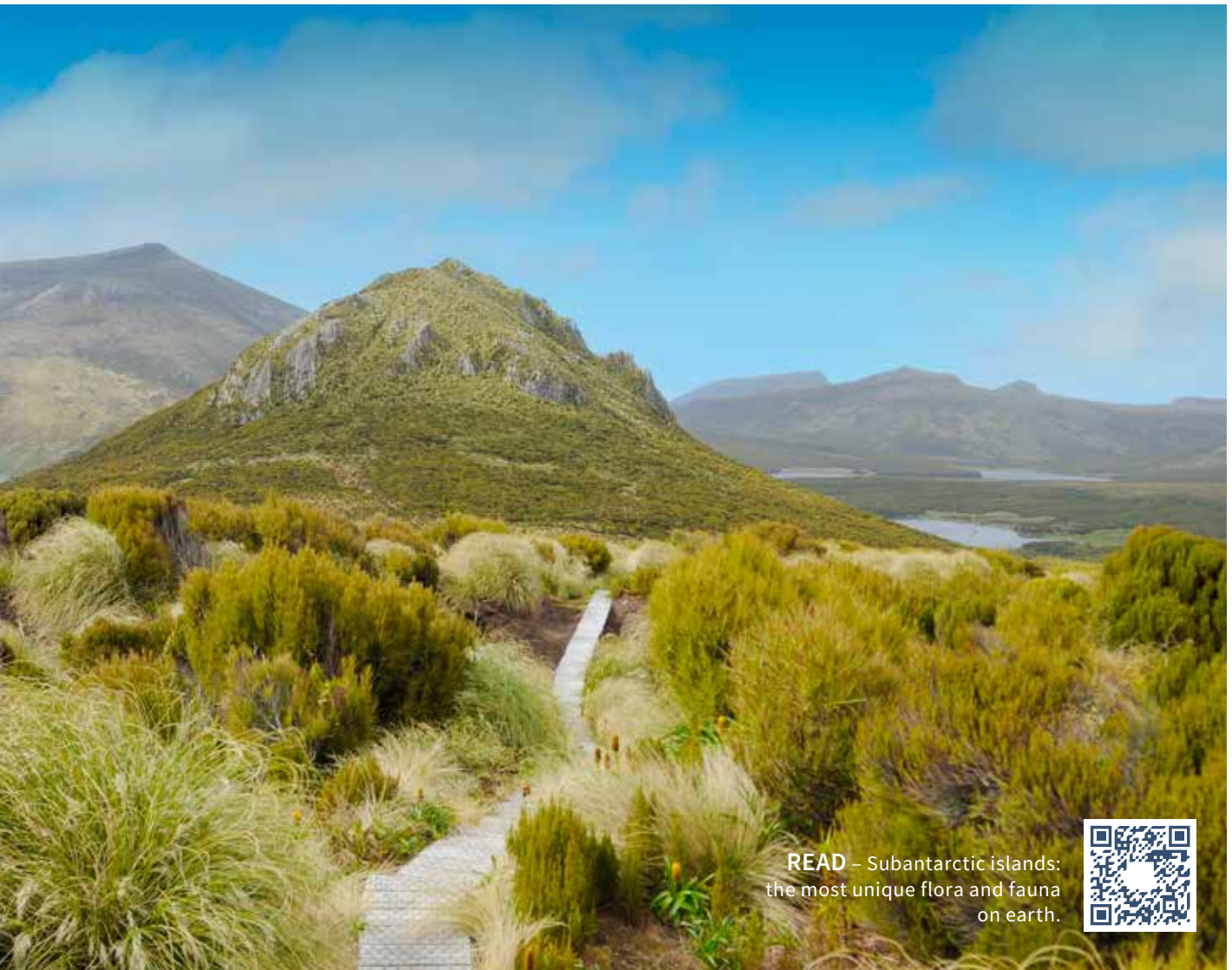

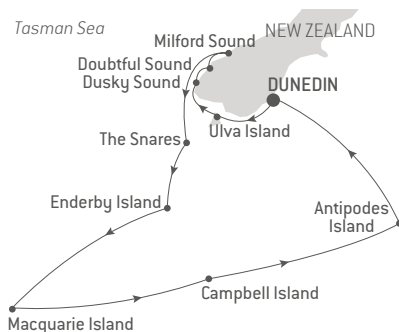

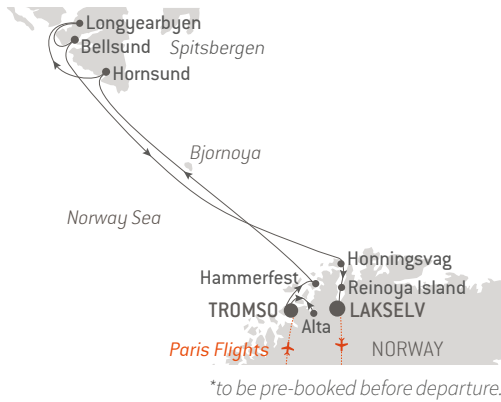

Fish is no joke here! One of the region's most important festivals is the cod festival. On the programme: fishing competitions, concerts, shared meals...

GET DRESSED!

BISSAGOS

An archipelago of 88 islands and islets.

In the Bissagos, outfits are often made from plant fibres and embellished with shells, pearls, coconuts... Especially for local celebrations.

A SENSE OF CELEBRATION...

As well as Carnival, the locals celebrate the Festival of Initiation, or the Branca, which marks the passage into adulthood. An important ceremony, where young people discover their place in society.



Norwegian folklore is celebrated with typical string instruments, such as the *hardingfele* fiddle or the *langeleik* zither. Musical inspiration is drawn from the spectacular natural surroundings.

The Lofoten Islands are home to a rich marine biodiversity of whales, dolphins, seals, etc. Inland, it's not unusual to spot elk, reindeer and musk oxen.

Local legends are an integral part of folklore. They feature the aquatic animals that sleep in the fjords, such as the giant whale, the sea serpent and the sea troll.

... IN MUSIC

The *djembe* (drum), the wooden and metal *balafon* (xylophone) and the whistles, are all emblematic instruments of the archipelago. Musicians are inspired by their religious beliefs and use music to communicate with their ancestors.

WHAT ABOUT WILDLIFE?

Green turtles, crocodiles, manatees and dolphins are the most common species in the Bissagos, along with 150 species of birds.

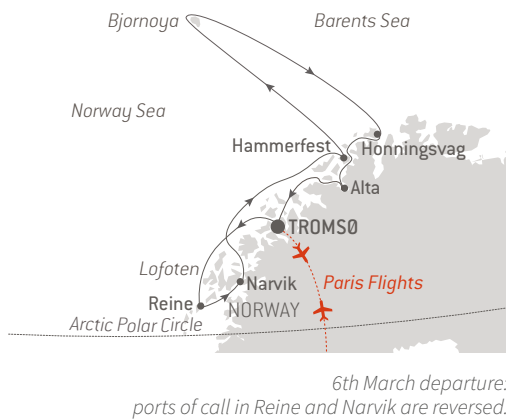

Here, spirituality is particularly strong and society is built on a matriarchal model. They believe in healing, the presence of spirits in nature and in sacred objects.

Through the eyes of Katia Silva

A marine eden to be preserved

Katia Silva is a marine biologist specialising in marine megafauna, as well as a PONANT naturalist guide in tropical areas and a divemaster. She is a true lover of the oceans and is sensitive to the ecological issues they face. Sharing her knowledge of the Caribbean is an important way for someone who has dedicated their life to the ocean to raise awareness among travellers.



"Discovering the waters of the Caribbean is to fall hopelessly in love with the ocean, nothing less. Visibility is so good that you feel like you're in an open-air aquarium. From the ship, it's not unusual to see turtles feeding at depths of over 25 metres! Protected areas such as the Cayos Cochinos archipelago and the Belize Barrier Reef – the second largest in the world – are incredibly rich, with over 500 species of fish, 60 species of coral and 5 of the world's 7 species of turtle. It's a place where you can watch whale sharks, dolphins, rays and a colourful ocean world pass by.

This region also offers you the chance to admire the extraordinary mangroves: one of the most important ecosystems, without which there would be no ocean. Fish

come here to lay their eggs and feed on all the nutrients that are hidden here. It's also an unspoilt paradise for birdwatchers.

I think there's no better way to realise the importance of preserving these places than to visit them yourself. I work to raise awareness among travellers so that they understand the current environmental challenges and the socio-economic context of these regions. Exploring Belize and the Caribbean also means rediscovering simple pleasures alongside local communities, such as enjoying a juicy mango with your feet in the warm sand, gazing out at a timeless panorama. Here, more than anywhere else, life displays its most beautiful colours."

Jérémie Bossert, a PONANT naturalist guide specialising in Madagascar, has developed an enlightened view of this destination, which boasts an extraordinary wealth of natural resources and a culture very different from that of its Indian Ocean neighbours. The vision of an expert, getting you off the beaten track.



"Fihavanana... This is the Madagascan philosophy, the one that brings everyone together and which has earned it a place in the country's constitution: a way of embodying the solidarity and resilience of the people on a daily basis. If you'd like to take part in a voyage outside of time, Madagascar is the place to go, far from the clichés of the western world.

Madagascar was one of the first islands in the Indian Ocean to be colonised by humans. The first inhabitants are thought to have come from what is now Indonesia and were joined by Africans and Arabs, giving rise to the Madagascan language, still shared today by the region's 18 ethnic groups. Come and meet these people whose customs are so different from those of their neighbours. Discover the Vezo people, nomads of the sea, living solely off the resources

of the ocean, for whom spirituality and homage to the ancestors are an integral part of daily life. Learn about the techniques used to build traditional boats, with no modern processes. Marvel at these elegant schooners as they take to the water with the wind filling their sails.

When it comes to scenery, the country also offers something unique, with no less than 80% of its plants and animals, such as lemurs, panther chameleons and the coua (a type of bird), being endemic. This is where you'll find the only rice paddies in this part of the world and a variety of ecosystems ranging from tropical rainforests to spiny forests, via coral beaches... A total change of scenery that awakens the senses and inspires genuine wonder."



Corals and giant tortoises

The richest archipelago in the world

David Beaune is a biologist and ecologist who is fascinated by Indonesia. When he's not studying the region's corals and tropical forests, he's an expedition leader for PONANT. A specialist in this extraordinary country, he has worked for many years in the Coral Triangle and is always happy to share anecdotes about this extremely rich region.



"This immense archipelago, the largest in the world, has as many islands – the majority of which are accessible only by sea – as it does cultures and landscapes. It is in Indonesia that the Wallace Line is drawn, passing between Lombok and Bali, giving rise to a unique curiosity. In the west of the country, we find Asian fauna, and in the east, Australian and Papuan fauna with rhinoceroses, tigers, elephants and monkeys at sunset, and cockatoos and tree kangaroos at sunrise.

This is also where the world's largest monitor lizards live, in the Komodo National Park, one of the jewels of our planet. Setting off in the company of a naturalist guide allows you to grasp the dimension of this biogeographical shock, like a journey between two worlds.

On land, the contrast is striking, with heavenly beaches, rocky cliffs, volcanoes, rainforests and alluvial forests... And underwater the wealth is just as fabulous, as Indonesia is part of the biodiverse coral triangle. The reefs seem to be more resilient here than elsewhere.

In Indonesia, we also take a step back in history, exploring the spice islands of Maumere and Banda Neira, where plants such as ginger, cloves and nutmeg have been coveted for centuries. As Europeans discovered new sea routes from the 15th century onwards, it was partly because they were looking to reach this infinitely rich archipelago. So you could almost say that Indonesia has encouraged people to explore and discover the world."

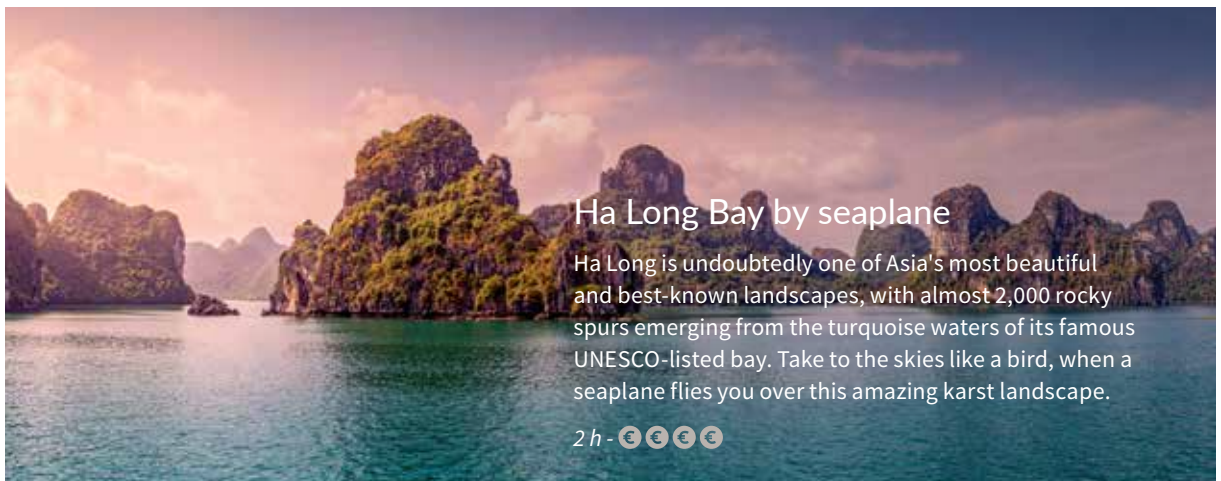

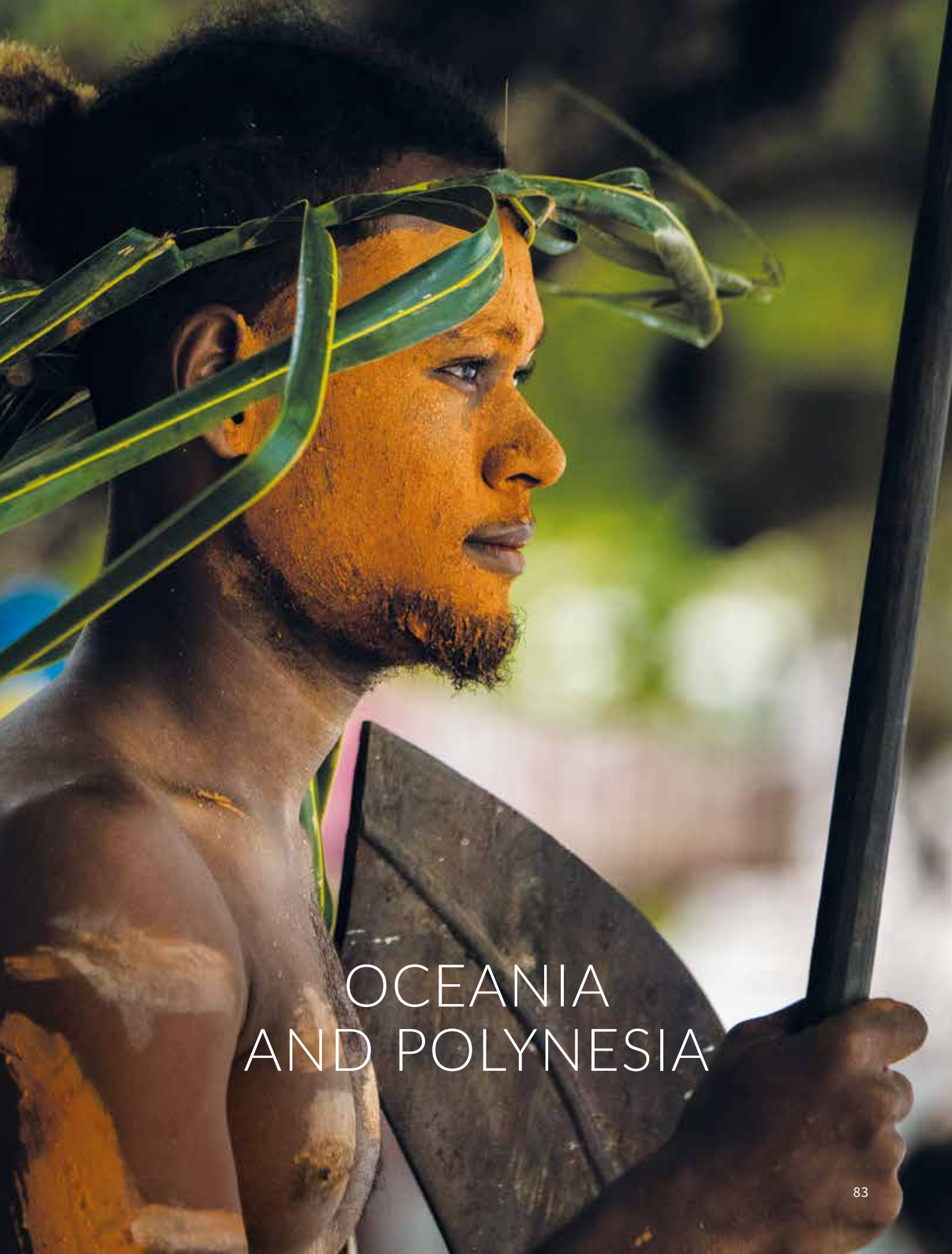

Pōwhiri or the art of Māori hospitality

The Māori people successfully preserved their traditions through the centuries.

Today, the Māori make up almost 15% of New Zealand's population, mainly concentrated in the North Island, the land of their ancestors. Zoom in on one of their most emblematic rites, representative of a enduring and warm culture.



It all begins at the *marae*, the sacred space in front of the *whareniui*, the communal wooden meeting house and heart of community life, decorated with carved figures of the village ancestors. This sacred space is where the *pōwhiri*, a highly codified traditional welcoming ceremony, takes place.

Imagine... Before you, a warrior begins dancing a *wero*, twirling his warrior spear or *taiaha*. This is a way to ensure that you come in peace. Once your good intentions have been established, the *karanga*, a song of welcome sung by women, begins. Then, hosts and visitors come together to greet each other, exchanging a simple handshake or a *hongi*, pressing their noses together and touching foreheads: sharing a 'breath of life' as the two souls meet. It is also customary in some

places for visitors to give their hosts a *koha*, a gift for the upkeep of the marae. This is followed by some speeches in Māori, songs and a *haka* – such as the 'ka mate' composed by Te Rauparaha, made famous by the New Zealand All Blacks rugby team. Finally, you gather for a generous feast or *hāngī*: a communal dish prepared using an age-old method of cooking food in a buried pit oven lined with volcanic embers.

Practised by the Māori as their ancestors did 200 years ago, this unchanging ceremony now expresses the resurgence that has been sweeping through the Māori community. A resurgence spurred by a reassertion of their social and spiritual identity characterised by strong values, such as mutual respect, generosity and sharing.



The Komodo dragon

The largest species of lizard in the world, the Komodo dragon (or Komodo Monitor) is the undisputed master of the national park of the same name in Indonesia.

Locals treat them with the greatest of respect, considering them the reincarnation of their loved ones.

They can reach a size of three metres.

★ Satawal, a unique stopover

Satawal is a coral atoll made up of a single island and forms part of the Caroline Islands, to the north of New Guinea. Its 500 or so inhabitants are famous for having preserved their traditional navigational skills, based on

local astronomical and maritime knowledge.

(1) **Madagascar:** visa delivered and charged onboard (€20, subject to change), valid for 14 days. Immunisation against diphtheria-tetanus-polio is recommended. Anti-malaria treatment is highly recommended. Contact your health professional for medical advice.

(2) **Tanzania:** a visa is mandatory and can be obtained online on <https://visa.immigration.go.tz/>. The cost is US\$50 for single entry with 3 months validity. Note that US citizens must apply for a multiple-entry visa at US\$100. The e-visa application takes approximately 10 days. On approval you will receive via e-mail a Visa Grant Notice which you will need to print and show upon arrival in Tanzania to get entry stamp on the passport. We recommend you start the e-visa application 2 months prior to your arrival date. The yellow fever vaccination is mandatory, bring along the original certificate. Contact your health professional for medical advice.

(3) **Qatar:** it is possible to obtain a multiple-entry visa at Doha Airport (the country's only point of entry and exit). This type of visa is issued free of charge for a 90-day period, upon presentation of a return ticket. If Doha is a

port of call mid-cruise, the visa will be issued on board (a fee may apply). Mandatory insurance: you are required to have a valid health insurance policy (for arrivals by air only – restriction lifted for arrivals by sea) which must be purchased online prior to departure, from an insurance provider approved by the Qatar Ministry of Public Health. This requirement also applies to visitors eligible for visa issuance upon arrival at the airport (this includes French nationals).

(4) **Oman:** citizens of the USA, Canada, UK, Australia, Japan, Germany no longer need to get a visa for stays up to 14 days. For other nationalities, an e-visa must be obtained before your cruise (application should be made within the month preceding your departure). You can apply on <https://evisa.rop.gov.om>. The e-visa document is valid for 1 month starting from date of issuance.

(5) **Saudi Arabia:** Saudi Arabia grants tourist visas to French, Belgian and Swiss nationals. It is possible to request a tourist visa on arrival, but we highly recommend applying for an electronic visa prior to travel to guarantee a smooth and fast entry into the country. They are easily available online via this link: <https://visa.visitsaudi.com/>.

(6) **Bahrain:** a visa is required to travel to Bahrain. A 14-day visa can be obtained directly upon arrival at the airport (fee: BHD 5). An e-visa can also be obtained online via this link: <https://www.evisa.gov.bh/>. This visa may be extended by up to 14 days.

(7) **Jordan:** a visa is mandatory (current cost 40 JOD). The visa is included for guests participating in a PONANT pre- or post-cruise programme. In order to secure your visa, please send a copy of your passport to PONANT 30 days prior to your cruise departure.

The validity of those visas are restricted to the duration of PONANT pre- and post-cruise programs. Groups of tourists visiting Jordan for a minimum stay of 2 consecutive nights and arriving through Amman Airport, whose programme has been organised by a Jordanian agency, benefit of a complimentary visa on condition that they are met by the local Jordanian agency at the airport. Rules and regulations regarding visa are subject to change by the government without any prior notice. Guests not participating on PONANT pre- or post-cruise programs will have to pay for the visa at the arrival or departure airport. Double entry visas can be obtained prior to the cruise and have a validity of 3 months.

(8) **Egypt:** visa valid for 30 days, delivered and charged onboard (€25, subject to change).

(9) **Réunion:** some nationalities may require a visa. Please check on <https://france-visas.gouv.fr/>.

FOR CRUISES OFFERING SCUBA DIVING

Guests may take part in scuba diving activities, providing certain conditions are respected, in line with the applicable health, scientific and medical conditions in force on the day of the dive. Guests who wish to scuba dive are required to provide the onboard diving monitor with a valid medical certificate authorising them to scuba dive, as well as their certification card and their up-to-date dive log. Within the context of the health measures relating to COVID-19, you will also be required to complete a health declaration. You will be given this form when you pre-book your dive.

For yachting cruises, the minimum level required for scuba diving is 1 star CMAS or the PADI Open Water Diver (or equivalent). The certification card, the diving log book and a recent medical certificate (less than 12 months) must be presented to our main diving instructor at the beginning of the cruise.

For expedition cruises, the minimum level required for scuba diving is 2 star CMAS or the PADI Advanced Open Water Diver (or equivalent). The certification card, the diving log book and a recent medical certificate (less than 12 months) must be presented to our main diving instructor at the beginning of the cruise.

Mask and snorkel: for health reasons due to COVID-19, we strongly recommend that you come on board with your own mask and snorkel. As an exception, you will be able to borrow them in accordance with sanitary conditions.
